#### Branch Libraries

# April Recap

- ❖ We welcomed some new staff members, including Yolanda Alejandre as Administrative Aide, Maria Lanfair as part-time Clerk at Central, Pat Gross as part-time Sorting Room Page, Heidy Montes as part-time Page at Mundy, and Jenna Marshall as part-time Page at Betts. In addition, Laura Nebuchadnezzar was promoted from Clerk II at Soule to Librarian I at White, and Magen Solano was promoted from Clerk I at Beauchamp to Librarian Assistant at Mundy.
- Several branches participated in multi-generational projects in April. White Branch hosted a Proud Places Project Cleanup event, which drew over 150 volunteers of all ages to clean up trash, ready the Community Garden, and paint and power wash buildings on Butternut Street; Paine hosted an art reception for Huntington students, and 127 students, family members, and teachers attended the event; and Mundy had a special Grandparents Day at Providence House, with a storytime, outdoor photo booth, and a craft that grandparents and their grandchildren made together.
- ❖ Hazard Branch celebrated Ukrainian Heritage Month with several programs and activities, including a performance of traditional Ukrainian dance with a family craft; a Pysanky class, to learn how to decorate eggs in a traditional method with elaborate designs; and a family craft using flowers and ribbons to make Ukrainian-style "vinok" floral crowns.

## Coming Up

- ❖ Paine Branch has partnered with CARES at LeMoyne to provide an upcoming series for people 55+ about fall prevention, presented by occupational therapists. The director of CARES is also interested in providing a series for older adults on the spirituality of aging, bringing in local spiritual leaders to discuss topics of spirituality with an emphasis on how they relate to aging, such as regrets, letting go, starting your third age, and gratitude.
- ❖ Jenny Dickinson from the County Health Department's Early Intervention Program is interested in new community partnerships including city branch libraries. Early Intervention provides speech, physical, occupational, and special instruction therapies to children who have deficiencies or diagnoses that qualify them for the program. This has traditionally been a home-based service, but providers who are able to use community spaces can provide care to a greater number of families, and also learn about library programs and services that may provide additional benefit to them.
- ❖ I have been meeting with programming staff from several branches since December to research and plan our Memory Café, and our first program in the series is set to take place at Betts on May 23 at 10:30am. Together with the Communications Department, Aran from Betts, Kate from Central, Mike from Hazard, and Tatiana from Paine have worked hard to develop a slate of programs that will appeal to patrons with memory issues and their caregivers.
